n trying to sell new fossil fuel consumption taxes to the American people, President Obama touted Spain as a country where green jobs growth was creating a vibrant economy. The facts tell a different story. According to a 2009 study at Madrid's Universidad Rey Juan Carlos, promises that green jobs would create an economic boom proved to be pie in the sky. According to Professor Gabriel Calzada, for every green job created, Spain has lost 2.3 jobs in other sectors of the economy. The result?
